

Certificate in Preparing to Work in Adult Social Care Level 2

Who is the course for?

Around 1.5 million people work in adult social care in the UK. They provide personal and practical support, helping people live independent lives and making sure that they have dignity, choice and control.

This nationally recognised qualification will support those who work in, or would like to work in a care organisation, large or small.

What are the benefits of doing this course?

The course will introduce the knowledge required to understand the role of a care worker, principles of personal development, person-centred approaches to care, equality diversity and inclusion, and communication. Safeguarding and protection of adults in care settings and the duty of care of a care worker is also a key element of the course.


It will look at handling information in care settings, health and safety issues, and legislation relating to the secure handling of information. Issues such as manual handling, infection con-


Progression opportunities

By undertaking this programme, candidates will be able to further their own continuous professional development, which may improve their career prospects.

Course delivery and assessment

The programme enables learners to complete the course in their own time, and all study material and resources are provided. Learners have access to a tutor and the programme is marked based on modular assessment. There is also the opportunity to work through a series of reflective activities designed to reinforce the learning.





Course content

The Level 2 Certificate in Preparing to Work in Adult Social Care comprises 12 sections across three module workbooks as follows:

- ▶ The role of the social care worker
- ▶ Personal development in adult social care settings
- ▶ Person centred approaches in adult social care settings
- ▶ Research and personal development planning activities
- ▶ Diversity, equality and inclusion in adult social care settings
- ▶ Communication in adult social care settings
- ▶ Safeguarding and protection in health and social care
- ▶ Implementing duty of care in health, social care or children's and young people's settings
- ▶ Resource development activities
- ▶ Handling information in social care settings
- ▶ Health and safety in social care settings
- ▶ Scenario and self-reflection activities

Entry requirements

Learners should be aged 18 and over, but otherwise there are no entry requirements.
