

Certificate in Principles of End of Life Care

Level 2

Who is the course for?

Aimed at anyone who wishes to improve their knowledge and understanding of end of life care and palliative care. It has relevance to all types of care settings, including hospices, care homes, care in the community and primary care.

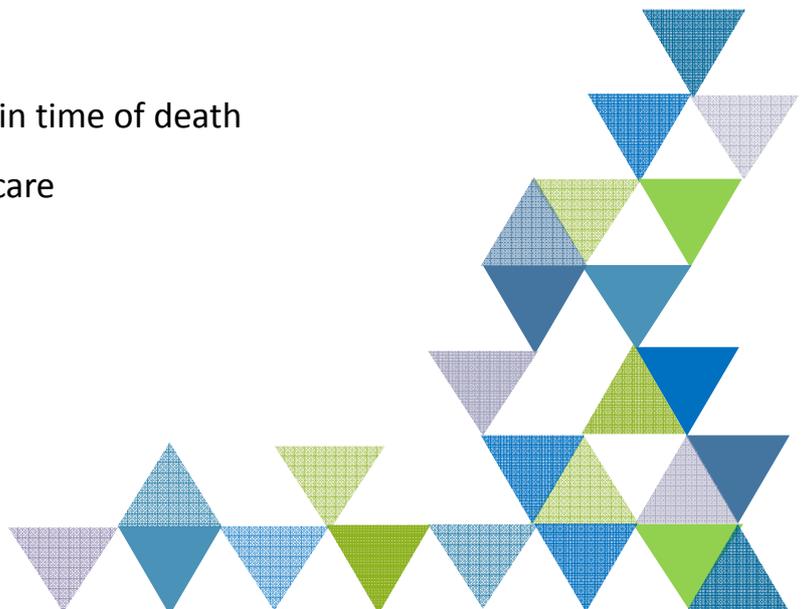
What are the benefits of doing this course?

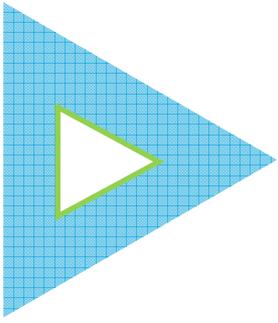
Learners will develop their knowledge and understanding of: the different perspectives on death and dying; the aims of end of life care; the principles of person-centred care planning; the support needed to manage pain and discomfort; how dementia impacts on an individual's end of life care; the role of the health and social care worker at the time of death; and how to appropriately support the bereaved.

Course content

The Level 2 Certificate in Principles of End of Life Care comprises six units across three module workbooks as follows:

- ▶ Understand how to work in end of life care
- ▶ Care planning in end of life care
- ▶ Understand how to provide support to manage pain and discomfort
- ▶ End of life care and dementia
- ▶ Understand the role of the care worker in time of death
- ▶ Understand loss and grief in end of life care





Progression opportunities

By undertaking this programme, candidates will be able to further their own continuous professional development, which may improve their career prospects.

Course delivery and assessment

The programme enables learners to complete the course in their own time, and all study material and resources are provided. Learners have access to a tutor and the programme is marked based on modular assessment. There is also the opportunity to work through a series of reflective activities designed to reinforce the learning.

Entry requirements

Learners should be aged 16 and over but otherwise there are no specific entry requirements for this programme.
