
What are the benefits of doing this course?

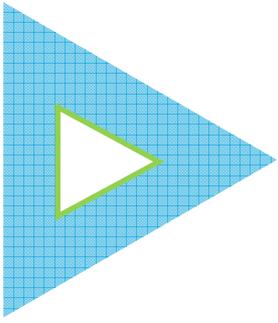

Course content

The Level 2 Certificate in the Principles of the Prevention and Control of Infection in Health-care Settings comprises four units across two module workbooks as follows:

- ▶ Principles of the causes and spread of infection
- ▶ Principles of the importance of personal hygiene and health
- ▶ Principles of decontamination, cleaning and waste management
- ▶ Principles of infection prevention and control

By undertaking this programme, candidates will be able to further their own continuous professional development, which may improve their career prospects.

Course delivery and assessment

The programme enables learners to complete the course in their own time, and all study material and resources are provided. Learners have access to a tutor and the programme is marked based on modular assessment.
